# HIS MERCY ENDURES FOREVER [PSALMS, BOOK 5, PART 1: PSALMS 107-118]

When the people of God returned to Israel after their Babylonian exile, there was a need for repair, reconciliation, and rejoicing. The city, the temple, and the people of God needed rebuilding and restoration. Before that could happen, though, the people of God needed to examine the reasons for their exile and the reasons for their return.

The first dozen psalms in Book 5 of the Psalms collection are a record of this examination and the results and responses. These psalms continue to serve as a guide for those who have been distant with the LORD and desire to draw close, and also for those who seek to develop a deeper, more loving relationship with the living God.

The opening songs in this book, Psalms 107-118, begin and end with the goodness and mercy, the absolutely faithful righteousness of the LORD our God, laying the foundation for a life of worship in devotion to the one true living God. Looking clearly at the world and its corruption, the people of Israel learned to fix their eyes and hopes upon the holiness of the LORD alone.

Join us as we explore how these psalms guide us in how we mature in our love for the LORD our God and our neighbours.

## Deuteronomy 7

7The LORD did not set His love on you nor choose you because you were more in number than any other people, for you were the least of all peoples; 8but because the LORD loves you, and because He would keep the oath which He swore to your fathers, the LORD has brought you out with a mighty hand, and redeemed you from the house of bondage, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt.

9Therefore know that the LORD your God, He is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and mercy for a thousand generations with those who love Him and keep His commandments; 10and He repays those who hate Him to their face, to destroy them. He will not be slack with him who hates Him; He will repay him to his face. 11Therefore you shall keep the commandment, the statutes, and the judgments which I command you today, to observe them.

#### Ezra 5

1Then the prophet Haggai and Zechariah the son of Iddo, prophets, prophesied to the Jews who were in Judah and Jerusalem, in the name of the God of Israel, who was over them. 2So Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel and Jeshua the son of Jozadak rose up and began to build the house of God which is in Jerusalem; and the prophets of God were with them, helping them.

3At the same time Tattenai the governor of the region beyond the River and Shethar-Boznai and their companions came to them and spoke thus to them: "Who has commanded you to build this temple and finish this wall?" 4Then, accordingly, we told them the names of the men who were constructing this building. 5But the eye of their God was upon the elders of the Jews, so that they could not make them cease till a report could go to Darius. Then a written answer was returned concerning this matter.

## Ezra 6

19And the descendants of the captivity kept the Passover on the fourteenth day of the first month. 20For the priests and the Levites had purified themselves; all of them were ritually clean. And they slaughtered the Passover lambs for all the descendants of the captivity, for their brethren the priests, and for themselves. 21Then the children of Israel who had returned from the captivity ate together with all who had separated themselves from the filth of the nations of the land in order to seek the LORD God of Israel. 22And they kept the Feast of Unleavened Bread seven days with joy; for the Lord made them joyful, and turned the heart of the king of Assyria toward them, to strengthen their hands in the work of the house of God, the God of Israel.

## Ezra 7

1Now after these things, in the reign of Artaxerxes king of Persia, Ezra the son of Seraiah, the son of Azariah, the son of Hilkiah, 2the son of Shallum, the son of Zadok, the son of Ahitub, 3the son of Amariah, the son of Azariah, the son of Meraioth, 4the son of Zerahiah, the son of Uzzi, the son of Bukki, 5the son of Abishua, the son of Phinehas, the son of Eleazar, the son of Aaron the chief priest—6this Ezra came up from Babylon; and he was a skilled scribe in the Law of Moses, which the LORD God of Israel had given.

The king granted him all his request, <u>according to the hand of the LORD his God upon him</u>. 7Some of the children of Israel, the priests, the Levites, the singers, the gatekeepers, and the Nethinim came up to Jerusalem in the seventh year of King Artaxerxes.

8And Ezra came to Jerusalem in the fifth month, which was in the seventh year of the king. 9On the first day of the first month he began his journey from Babylon, and on the first day of the fifth month he came to Jerusalem, according to the good hand of his God upon him. 10For Ezra had prepared his heart to seek the Law of the Lord, and to do it, and to teach statutes and ordinances in Israel.

27Blessed be the LORD God of our fathers, who has put such a thing as this in the king's heart, to beautify the house of the LORD which is in Jerusalem, 28and has extended mercy to me before the king and his counsellors, and before all the king's mighty princes.

So I was encouraged, as the hand of the LORD my God was upon me; and I gathered leading men of Israel to go up with me.

## Ezra 8

15Now I gathered them by the river that flows to Ahava, and we camped there three days. And I looked among the people and the priests, and found none of the sons of Levi there. 16Then I sent for Eliezer, Ariel, Shemaiah, Elnathan, Jarib, Elnathan, Nathan, Zechariah, and Meshullam, leaders; also for Joiarib and Elnathan, men of understanding. 17And I gave them a command for Iddo the chief man at the place Casiphia, and I told them what they should say to Iddo and his brethren the Nethinim at the place Casiphia—that they should bring us servants for the house of our God.

18Then, by the good hand of our God upon us, they brought us a man of understanding, of the sons of Mahli the son of Levi, the son of Israel, namely Sherebiah, with his sons and brothers, eighteen men; 19and Hashabiah, and with him Jeshaiah of the sons of Merari, his brothers and their sons, twenty men; 20also of the Nethinim, whom David and the leaders had appointed for the service of the Levites, two hundred and twenty Nethinim. All of them were designated by name.

21Then I proclaimed a fast there at the river of Ahava, that we might humble ourselves before our God, to seek from Him the right way for us and our little ones and all our possessions. 22For I was ashamed to request of the king an escort of soldiers and horsemen to help us against the enemy on the road, because we had spoken to the king, saying, "The hand of our God is upon all those for good who seek Him, but His power and His wrath are against all those who forsake Him." 23So we fasted and entreated our God for this, and He answered our prayer.

28And I said to them, "<u>You are holy to the LORD</u>; the articles are holy also; and the silver and the gold are a freewill offering to the LORD God of your fathers. 29Watch and keep them until you weigh them before the leaders of the priests and the Levites and heads of the fathers' houses of Israel in Jerusalem, in the chambers of the house of the LORD."

31Then we departed from the river of Ahava on the twelfth day of the first month, to go to Jerusalem. And the hand of our God was upon us, and He delivered us from the hand of the enemy and from ambush along the road. 32So we came to Jerusalem, and stayed there three days.

33Now on the fourth day the silver and the gold and the articles were weighed in the house of our God by the hand of Meremoth the son of Uriah the priest, and with him was Eleazar the son of Phinehas; with them were the Levites, Jozabad the son of Jeshua and Noadiah the son of Binnui, 34with the number and weight of everything. All the weight was written down at that time.

35The children of those who had been carried away captive, who had come from the captivity, offered burnt offerings to the God of Israel: twelve bulls for all Israel, ninety-six rams, seventy-seven lambs, and twelve male goats as a sin offering. All this was a burnt offering to the Lord.

36And they delivered the king's orders to the king's satraps and the governors in the region beyond the River. So they gave support to the people and the house of God.

## Psalm 107:1-20

- Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, And He saved them out of their distresses.
- He brought them out of darkness and the shadow of death, And broke their chains in pieces.
- Oh, that men would give thanks to the LORD for His goodness, And for His wonderful works to the children of men!
- 16 For He has broken the gates of bronze, And cut the bars of iron in two.
- 17 Fools, because of their transgression, And because of their iniquities, were afflicted.
- 18 Their soul abhorred all manner of food, And they drew near to the gates of death.
- 19 Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, And He saved them out of their distresses.
- He sent His word and healed them, And delivered them from their destructions.

## Psalm 107:21-30

- Oh, that men would give thanks to the LORD for His goodness, And for His wonderful works to the children of men!
- Let them sacrifice the sacrifices of thanksgiving, And declare His works with rejoicing.
- 23 Those who go down to the sea in ships, Who do business on great waters,
- 24 They see the works of the LORD, And His wonders in the deep.
- 25 For He commands and raises the stormy wind, Which lifts up the waves of the sea.
- They mount up to the heavens, They go down again to the depths; Their soul melts because of trouble.
- They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunken man, And are at their wits' end.
- Then they cry out to the LORD in their trouble, And He brings them out of their distresses.
- 29 He calms the storm, So that its waves are still.
- Then they are glad because they are quiet; So He guides them to their desired haven.

## Psalm 107:31-43

- Oh, that men would give thanks to the LORD for His goodness, And for His wonderful works to the children of men!
- Let them exalt Him also in the assembly of the people, And praise Him in the company of the elders.
- He turns rivers into a wilderness, And the water-springs into dry ground;
- A fruitful land into barrenness, For the wickedness of those who dwell in it.
- 35 He turns a wilderness into pools of water, And dry land into water-springs.
- There He makes the hungry dwell, That they may establish a city for a dwelling place,
- 37 And sow fields and plant vineyards, That they may yield a fruitful harvest.
- He also blesses them, and they multiply greatly; And He does not let their cattle decrease.
- When they are diminished and brought low Through oppression, affliction, and sorrow,
- He pours contempt on princes,
  And causes them to wander in the wilderness where there is no way;
- 41 Yet He sets the poor on high, far from affliction, And makes their families like a flock.
- The righteous see it and rejoice, And all iniquity stops its mouth.
- Whoever is wise will observe these things,
  And they will understand the lovingkindness of the LORD.

  - They have also surrounded me with words of hatred,
- And fought against me without a cause.
